Welcome to our website. We get a lot of older horses that have become hard keepers simply because they have lost most of their teeth or have worn them down so smooth that they cannot chew their food well anymore. If they cannot chew, they cannot break down their food enough for their digestive systems to get the good out. This causes them to lose weight and break down. My own horse is over forty and does well because we have found a few feeds that are easy for him to handle.

These are the feeds that we have tried and found acceptable for our older horses.

MOORMANS ADM ALLIANCE FEEDS

Our personal favorite is the Moorman's **Patriot Senior** feed. It has the roughage that the horses need, without having to chew hay. This is the feed that 40+ yr old Ben eats, and he is in excellent condition. Soft, small pellets, easily moistened by the horse. Also mixes easily with water for a warm mash if desired.

Moorman's also makes Senior Glo, which is slightly more expensive, but also a very good feed.

WOODY'S FEED

WOODY'S SENIOR, The best we have found but hard to get in the Texas Panhandle area around Amarillo. I used this feed for years, but it became impossible to get. The pellets are soft, and turn to mush as soon as the horse slobbers on them !
